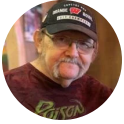
OCT 16, 1947 - JUN 29, 2022

A memorial service will be held at the Wilson Funeral Home on Wednesday, July 6, 2022, at 12:00 PM.






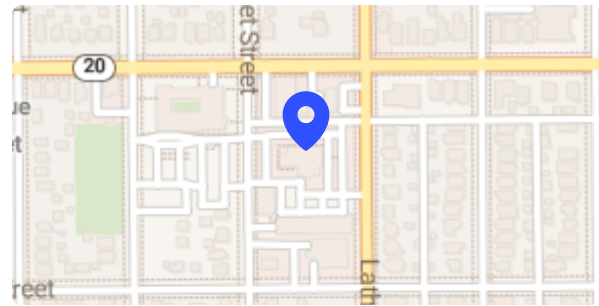

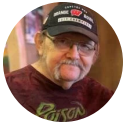
