Racine - Mr. Alexander Wagner, 90, passed away at Wheaton Franciscan Healthcare - All Saints on Saturday, April 24, 2010.

Alexander Wagner was born in Racine to the late Martin and Mary (nee: Ruppel) Wagner on November 15, 1919. He lived in Racine all his life. He was united in marriage to Lorraine E. Volz on September 28, 1946.

Mr. Wagner was a member of Grace Lutheran Church. He served in the United States Air Force in England during World War II. He was also a member of the Moose Lodge where he and his wife would square dance. Mr. Wagner was employed by the Western Publishing Company and retired in the mid 1980s.
