George A. Clark, Sr., 80, passed away on March 17, at the Wisconsin Veteran's Home in Union Grove.

Mr. Clark was born Aug. 12, 1927, in LaValle, Wisconsin to Jasper and Georgia Clark.

He spent his early years in Abelman, Wisconsin, before enlisting in the U.S. Navy, and then the U.S. Air Force, where he served his country for seven years at bases in Germany and England. After his discharge, Mr. Clark moved to Racine, where he worked for the J.I. Case Co. for more than 31 years until his retirement.

Mr. Clark was preceded in death by his parents, and brothers Harry Clark and Glen Clark.
